

Tri-University Meeting - August 12, 2021

All three state Retirees Associations were well-represented at our quarterly Tri-University meeting on Zoom. Immediate Past President Carl Cross and Past President Jan Thompson represented ASURA. Alison Hughes joined from Tucson to represent UARA, and NAURA was well represented by Betsy Kerr, Kathleen Zahl, Carole Mandino and our host Shannan Rice.



A lively discussion about member volunteerism was led by Alison Hughes. They currently have only two board members and are experiencing difficulty in getting new members. A letter signed by the University President was sent to individuals inviting them to join UARA, but there was little response. They offered a session on how to prepare for a power outage, but only 8 or 9 participated. NAU suggested having monthly webinars given by members and university staff and faculty. ASU offered that it has an information table at three of their campus staff appreciation days. Other suggestions by the group included game nights with prizes, a raffle, and book clubs/meet the author.

Betsy Kerr then asked how organizations were responding to the recent surge of new Covid cases as it related to in-person programming? It was agreed that masking was suggested for all in-person activities and that outside gatherings was the best option.

Betsy was also interested in learning more about the "Age-Friendly" designation that ASU has. According to Forbes: "There are now 51 colleges and universities around the world that are part of what's known as the Age-Friendly University Global Network. They range from mammoth Arizona State University to tiny Williams James College in Newton, Mass. in the United States and include schools in Europe, Asia and Canada." "To become an Age-Friendly University, a school just needs to endorse the 10 principles that Dublin City University came up with when it launched the initiative in 2012." (The principles are included in the Forbes article).

Shannan asked about organizational benefits offered to retirees. UofA has free parking and IT support available and ASU offers free parking and email support to Emeritus.

The meeting concluded with an informative discussion on ways the three organizations can work together:

- Tri-University events
- Share Zoom meetings
- Virtual tours (e.g., ASU Art Collection)
- Concert by a retiree
- Webinar on hiking and trail systems



Major new features


- A top menu that lets you readily see what is available. The organization of the menu is the result of ideas and suggestions from several people and from usage data on the old site.

ASURA Video History Project: Recipient of the AROHE HERO

It is with great pride that I announce the ASURA Video History Project has been bestowed the prestigious 2020 "HERO Innovation Award", given annually by the Association of Retirement Organizations in Higher Education (AROHE).

Our nomination was originally submitted by one of our past presidents, Jan Thompson, and recommended by Robert Spindler, University Archivist at the Arizona State University Library. While I was not personally involved with the project, I am very proud to currently be at the helm of ASURA as we navigate the 2020's.

The Video History Project began in 2002 and has long been a collaboration of past and present ASURA members. All those who began with and helped to develop the project are too numerous to mention but each one volunteered countless hours of interviewing, collecting and editing videos and was dedicated to maintaining the histories of ASURA members in perpetuity. I would be remiss to not mention the following four individuals who really carried the load for many years — Dave Scheatzle, Linda Van Scoy, John McIntosh and Roger Carter. Key individuals recently received letters from Dr. Michael Crow commending their work on this project.

The ASU Foundation provided support, including financial support, to help move this project forward. Additionally, through sound thought processes by former ASURA leaders, our organization was able to raise some \$70,000 for the project through a series of annual fund-raising golf tournaments and also through yearly member donations.

On behalf of our Executive Board and our full membership, I video taped a special thanks to AROHE for this special honor and for the hard work put into the project by ASURA members. This video will be aired at the October 12-14, 2021 AROHE Virtual Conference.

- Are your bookshelves too full?
- Are you downsizing your office or your home and don't have space for all of your books?



Donate your used books to us, and we will work with our partner, Friends of the Phoenix Public Library, to sell them. We'll use proceeds of the sale to support our programs. Half of the proceeds will be used for our ASURA scholarship that goes to an ASU student, and half will be used for our Video History project. When you drop off your books, the office volunteer will give you a Gift in Kind form to complete and sign. The form is sent to the ASU Foundation, a separate nonprofit organization that exists to support ASU. The Foundation will provide you with a gift receipt for tax purposes.

You may drop off your books at the ASURA Office, Community Services Bldg., 200 E. Curry Road, room 201B, Tempe, AZ, 85281. Please call the office before you come to make sure there is a staff volunteer in the office (480-965-7668).

You do not need to box your books and it's best that you do not. When drivers from Friends picks up the books, they load loose books into large bins and deliver them to their warehouse. You may put the books in bags or load them into container(s) which you will take with you after your delivery. If you need to box your books, please leave the tops of the boxes open so you can empty the books into the bins in the storeroom and then take the empty boxes with you. An office volunteer will assist you.

- For books that are on an ASU campus, ask Facilities Management to pick them up and deliver
 them to us. To accomplish this, your department assistant can complete and submit a <u>FACMAN</u>
 <u>service request</u> on an on-line form. Facilities will schedule a pickup date with the office assistant. Advise the office assistant to provide your name and department to the FACMAN representative who picks up the books.
- **OR** bring your books to <u>our office</u>. We have 2 dollies for your use. Parking is readily available by the building with 3 ramps into the building and an elevator to the 2nd floor.
