I. CALL TO ORDER

President David Schwalm called the meeting to order at 10 am.

IV. REVIEW AND APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF [DATE OF PRIOR] BOARD MEETING

The minutes of the May 11, 2011 Board meeting were approved with minor amendments.

V. FINANCIAL REPORT / TREASURER'S REPORT – CAROLYN MINNER, BILL MOOR

Bill Moor presented a draft of the ASURA Final Budget proposal, FY 2012. He pointed out that the budget consists of four ASU Foundation Funds (Operations, Special Projects, Scholarship Endowment, and Scholarship Spending) and a Public Affairs account administered by ASU Public Affairs. Bill noted the he will transfer \$4562 to "uncommitted funds" in the Operations budget from "uncommitted funds" in the Special Projects budget. That amount was incorrectly charged to the Operations budget in 2111. He also pointed out a major increase in the 2012-2013 ASURA Scholarship from\$6,500 to \$10,000 in the FY 2012 Proposed Budget to address the increase in tuition. The Board agreed, in addition, to add \$400 to the Operations expenses budget (Other Operations Costs) to cover Retirees Day lunch subsidies for guest speakers. In the Public Affairs Budget, \$250 was moved from "Office Supplies" to "Copier and Fax Maintenance." Acceptance of the budget as revised was moved, seconded, and approved.

ASRS Board of Trustees Meeting, July 15, 2011

- *ASRS Benchmarks The Board received from CEM Benchmarking a presentation on peer group comparisons. The peer group consisted of public pension systems in 14 other states, including North Carolina, Colorado, Oregon, Illinois and Iowa. ASRS rated slightly below the mean in administrative cost per member, and high in member service effectiveness. Its service score of 83 out of 100 was 8th highest in the entire CEM universe of states and foreign countries.
- 2. **Fund Rate of Return ASRS Director Paul Matson reported that the rate of return for fiscal year ending June 30, 2011 was 25%, highest in 25 years.
- 3. *<u>Director's Report</u> Director Matson reported that a law suit has been filed in opposition to recent legislation redefining the employer-employee contribution split from 50-50 to 47 53.
- 4. *The <u>value of the ASRS portfolio</u> as of May 31 was \$27,841,362,854, a drop of about \$400,000,000 from May 31, following closely the market trends for that period.
