The Financial Report was accepted as presented to the Board.

V. Ex-Officio Reports

• Emeritus College Liaison – Elmer Gooding

Jim advised the Board that he was contacted by Elmer Gooding regarding his position as the Emeritus College Liaison since he is no longer serving as Interim Dean of the Emeritus College or on the EC Board. Following discussion, the Board asked that Dr. Gooding continue in his role as the ASURA Emeritus College Liaison if he wishes.

ASU scientist Professor Cun-Zheng Ning has won worldwide recognition for a top innovation in white laser research. This technology takes the entire light spectrum and merges it into white light. This research will take the next generation of indoor lighting to the next level.

Professor Charles Arntzen won a top award last year for his pioneering research in "'pharming': engineering plants to produce specialized vaccines and other drugs and, specifically, ZMapp, an injectable synthetic serum he helped devise using genetically engineered antibodies grown in tobacco plants. • ASRS General – Larry Carlson

• Legislature – Hal White or Jeri Meeks

Jeri reported that ASU Capital Day was a success. Jeri spoke to the new state investment model with the Universities that speaks directly to Arizona resident student instate tuition and how ASURA can help affect state funding. Abby Polito and Steve Miller have put together a one page information sheet (included with attachments) on how to encourage individual legislators to support ABOR's \$32M funding ask. The flyer includes a link to the list of representatives. (Jeri asked the Board for permission to send an informational email blast to ASURA membership regarding this topic. Barry McNeill noted that if an **email** letter is sent to legislators, members may NOT use an ASU email account, they must use a personal email account.) Jeri noted that all 3 bills related to the Public Safety Personnel Retirement System have passed to the Governor who is expected to

Other bills of note:

sign the bills.

HB2072 – Firearms on university/college campus had a second read on 2/1/16 but has not gone further and is believed dead. HB2338 – Educational institutions; firearms; rights of way. This bill has passed the House, moved to the Senate and been assigned to the Gov and Rules Committee.

HB2548 – AZ Revised statues 15-1861 and 1864 related to Universities and Community College – Student's Right to Speak; added verbiage that would allow court action and compensatory damages.

HB2615 – Campuses; free speech zone, prohibiting limiting any area on campus; approved in the House, moved to Senate and

assigned to Rules and FMFR.

HB2157 – ASRS; political subdivision entities; precludes any new employee of a political subdivision entity from enrolling in ASRS. If approved ASRS estimates a significant debt to be repaid by current employees. Passed by a Committee of the House and gone nowhere else.

HB2178 – AZ Silver-haired Legislature; establishes the Legislature consisting of a nonpartisan panel of citizens who are at least 60 years of age and who are elected by their peers. This group will identify various issues and concerns affecting all Arizona citizens, discuss policy alternatives and possible solutions.

E. Health Insurance Liaison Council

• ADOA – Larry Carlson

Larry reported that insurance rates for retired ASRS members who are not Medicare eligible are high. ASRS Ins. is looking to go out to get better insurance rates for those members.

• ASRS – Joyce Hartman Diaz

Joyce reported that she is unable to participate on the ASRS Health Care Advisory Board since she is not covered by ASRS health insurance. An ASURA member who is covered by ASRS <u>health</u> insurance needs to be identified to serve on the Advisory Board.
