#### • Emeritus College Liaison -- Don Nilsen

Preparation is underway for the Twelfth Annual Emeritus College Symposium on the "Arts in a STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) World" to be held on Saturday, November 18, 2017 at the Carson Ballroom, Old Main, ASU Tempe Campus.

This annual symposium provides an opportunity for members of the College to share with their colleagues, through papers, presentations and performances their work, activities and interests. Call for presentations deadline is Friday, September 15, 2017.

Each month the ASU Emeritus College will be sponsoring a Short-Talks Luncheon speaker and a Colloquium speaker. One is being presented today (September 12) and the speaker is Burt Jacobs.

The Emeritus College is partnering with Osher, with New Adventures in Learning (Chandler-Gilbert Community College) and with New Frontiers (Mesa Community College).

Don mentioned that the Emeritus Voices journal is hot off the press and that the Emeritus College Newsletter comes out monthly.

Tara announced that the University Club is having a \$15 All-You-Can-Eat buffet tailgate party for members on September 16; reservations preferred.

- University Liaison -- Abby Polito No report.
- University Senate -- Tom Schildgen

Tom reported that the ASU Fall 2017 enrollment set a new record of 103,000 students. Approximately 30,000 are on-line students pursuing undergraduate and graduate degrees. The ASU Charter is inclusive so all qualified students are admitted, resulting in a student body that matches the demographics of the surrounding metropolitan area.

On September 12, ASU was named the #1 most innovative school in the nation for a third straight year.

For research expenditures, ASU ranks 8th in the nation for institutions that lack a medical school.

Campaign 2020 will reach its goals (\$1.5 Billion), and the athletic program has phenomenal facilities to recruit. The Global Sport Alliance with Adidas has resulted in Ken Shropshire coming to ASU from the University of Pennsylvania Wharton School of Business. The renovation of Sun Devil Stadium will be completed in one more year.

Tom credited President Crow and the senior leadership, along with dedicated faculty and staff, for orchestrating all of these accomplishments. He said it is important that the faculty understand what has been accomplished and where we have the opportunity to go in the near future.

Katie mentioned the Downtown Staff Appreciation BBQ will be held on September 18, 2017 and that there will be a Faculty /Staff Organization Fair on September 21, from 11:30 - 1:30 pm in the Arizona Ballroom of the Memorial Union on the Tempe Campus. She announced that the 2017 United Way Campaign will be starting up sometime this week. President Meeks asked Katie to send her a list of scheduled Staff BBQs for each campus.

Joy reported that our Scholarship recipient received her money, but there was a delay. She discussed glitches in the process causing the delay. Joy will work with the ASU Scholarship Office and update the Scholarship process between them and ASURA to improve efficiency.

The small group who went on the British Isle trip will be returning soon.

#### Book Collection -- Mary Stevens

Mary stated that any kind of donated books from the Emeritus College will be accepted except for dictionaries and encyclopedias. She indicated that the Friends of the Phoenix Public Library keep half of book sales proceeds. The money goes into special projects. Mary gave a run-down of the sale prices of different types of books; price range from \$25 to \$6.

#### E. Health Insurance Liaison Council

- ADOA -- Larry Carlson No report.
- ASRS -- Dick Jacob

Dick reported that the Board of Trustees met on August 25, 2017 for the first time in ten months with a legal quorum. Membership stands at eight, five of whom are newly appointed. Backgrounds of new Trustees can be found at

htpps://www.azasrs.gov/content/board-trustee-bios. One vacant position remains and Kevin McCarthy continues as Board Chair.

Key items addressed in the agenda are as follows:

- The Fund balance is currently around \$37.9B. The 2017 Rate of Return (RoR) on investments is tentatively calculated to be 13.9%; higher than the Fun's target 8%. The final figure awaits further analysis.
- 2. An Investment Committee recommended to adjust the Fund's Strategic Asset Allocation policy as follows: (a) Increase the Private Debt allocation from 10% to 12% within prescribed ranges, (b) Reduce the US High Yield Bond allocation from 4% to 2% within prescribed ranges. It was noted that a recently approved increase of the Private Debt allocation to 10% has been significantly successful in improving the Fund's performance. These recommendations were approved by the Board.
- 3. Representatives of the Fund's actuarial consultants, presented a detailed analysis of the Fund's performance in the context of the current assumed 8% RoR, as well as the Fund's liabilities. Motivated by more modest future earnings expectations, recommendations and options for reducing the RoR to 7.75% and 7.50% were presented along with their impacts on active member and employer contribution rates. The Board was tasked with studying the recommendations in preparation for action at the October 27, meeting.

Actions recommended in Item 3 are potentially among the most important considered by the Board of Trustees due to their potential impacts on employee paychecks and employer budgets. Unless altered by legislation, the performance level that is key to Permanent Benefit Increases would remain at 8%.

Connie reported she has continued to apply routine updates to the software that is used for our website. The basis for the site is a Drupal product created by the UTO, called Webspark. The UTO issues Webspark updates from time-to-time, and she applies those fixes and tests. The UTO has been very competent and helpful whenever she has had a problem with Webspark. She was surprised to learn that UTO's new offices moved to the University Services Building on Rural Road three years ago.
