- Government Liaison Council
 - Legislature Jeri Meeks, Pat Schneider Jeri reported on the second meeting of the Community and Legislative Partners in Aging (aka Senior Caucus). ASURA Lobbyists Tara Roesler and Jeri Meeks are attending these monthly caucus meetings at the Arizona Capitol this legislative season. Sponsored by the Governor's Council on Aging, these meetings will bring together a caucus of Arizona Senators, Representatives and community partners to discuss challenges facing Arizona's seniors. The February meeting addressed Honoring Healthcare Wishes in Arizona. It was an informative discussion between lawmakers, police, fireman, EMS representatives and nonprofit health information exchange (HIE) panelists. All were in agreement that these professionals are relying on relatives to provide documented end-of-life wishes and that it would be very beneficial for responders to have those wishes, along with medical records, available before they met the patient. Efforts are being made to make this information available to responders through a health information exchange database. Jeri also gave a rundown of bills the Government Liaison team is watching, with a specific discussion about a strike everything bill that just appeared changing a expense reporting requirement from "notarized" to "under penalty of perjury", which is a federal crime and carries at least 1.5 years jail time. This bill has a lot of support in the azleg.gov system. Pres Roesler and Jeri Meeks expressed reservations about remaining as a lobbyist if this bill is signed into law. Whereas it's probably meant to weed out bad actors' good people could be harmed for forgetting to file a quarterly or annual report.
