- Ages 0-18 (infant, toddler, elementary, older youth)
- Removed from homes due to abuse and/or neglect
- Living with relatives (kinship), in a foster home, or in a group home
- Experienced trauma
- Just kids!

Real Impact


Youth who have a CASA:

Perform better in school
Spend less time in foster care
Experience fewer foster placements
Receive more court-ordered services
Services are more carefully targeted
& received sooner



Less likely to re-enter foster care system

CASA of Arizona

VOICES is committed to providing a CASA volunteer for every child in foster care who needs one. We reach individuals in the community who understand the need for advocacy and giving local foster youth a voice.

Monthly

15-20 hours working on the assigned case, gathering information about the child & the case2 or more visits with your CASA child(ren)Communication with professionals, key players

Yearly

Write a summary report for the judge before hearings (Twice yearly for youth 3+ years)

Participate in court hearings & other meetings Ongoing continuing education (12 hours)






